#### **Letter From the Executive Director**

**Since 1964**, The Wilderness Center's unwavering mission has been to educate and engage our community on the importance of conservation for the betterment of all of us. For nearly 60 years, TWC has remained focused on serving our community through environmental education and the conservation of important habitats and preserves. We are proud of and fully believe in that mission and we plan to do everything we can to ensure this important work continues for at least another 60 years.

In order to serve our mission and our community, we also have a responsibility to manage and utilize our donors' investments in us to the highest possible use. To that end, you may notice a few tweaks being made to our programs, our communications, and our requests for donations. As most of you know, TWC underwent a Strategic Visioning process recently. With the input and information sharing from many of you, we learned that our members would like to see more features on our main site in Wilmot, more of our preserves open to our members for hiking and learning, to host more family focused programming onsite and within our communities, more integration of our education programs with local schools, and increase our conservation work for imperiled habitats. We all think those are AWESOME goals! We are thrilled

with the ideas and vision for TWC the community created together.

To reach these goals and ensure we continue serving our community, you are going to start noticing a few changes that are meant to increase our efficiency and expand our reach via increased audiences. One of those changes will be the new sign-up process for our programming. In order to keep our family programming low cost for the public, we now offer an online sign-up so we know in advance how many families to expect and to increase our communication with those families in case we need to make a change in the programming. As with many of you, TWC is trying to do more with the resources we already have, and that means we may have to occasionally postpone or move programs if we do not receive enough sign-ups to at least cover our costs for materials and staffing. With growth and change come some growing pains, so while we plan to always offer our trails and access to nature free of charge for everyone, we have to move to cost sharing model for our programs. As we move towards a capital campaign to raise the funds to create the experiences you identified as being the most urgent and important, we do not want to lose the connections with all of you, our supporters, and we look forward to seeing you out on the trails.

#### Sigrist Woods Inducted Into The Old Growth Forest Network

On April 12, our very own Sigrist Woods at The Wilderness Center was inducted into the Old-Growth Forest Network. Somewhat of a celebrity in the conservation world, Dr. Joan Maloof, Executive Director of the Old-Growth Forest Network, travelled to our area and presented a plaque to TWC's Executive Director Jeanne Gural, Board President Roger Baker, and Senior Biologist Gary Popotnik. The dedication marked the addition of the 19th forest to join the Old-Growth Forest Network in the state of Ohio.

Sigrist Woods are located on the lands of the Kaskaskia peoples, who inhabited this region before European settlement. The 21-acre old-growth area has been a dedicated State Natural Landmark since 1983. A number of trees in this old-growth area date to nearly 175 years old, as determined by field studies from the Wooster Tree Ring Lab at the College of Wooster. These are largely white oak (*Quercus alba*). In addition, there are burr oak (*Q. macrocarpa*) and sugar maple (*Acer saccharum*), in this old-growth forest.

The Old-Growth Forest Network (OGFN) connects people with nature by creating a national network of protected, mature, publicly accessible, native forests. OGFN intends to preserve at least one forest in every county in the U.S. that can sustain a forest. OGFN works to identify forests for the Network, ensure their

protection from logging, and inform people of the forest locations. Founded in 2021 by Dr. Joan Maloof, the network currently consists of over 150 forests across 28 states.

Dr. Maloof noted, "We look forward to adding more forests to the Network in the future. We depend on a volunteer in each county to help us identify candidate forests. Karen Koch, County Coordinator for the Old-Growth Forest Network has been an invaluable volunteer supporter. In addition to creating a network of forests, we are also creating a network of people who care about forests." ## Become an Ohio Certified Volunteer Naturalist

For the past 15 years, The Wilderness Center has been helping adults reconnect with nature and expand their natural history knowledge through the Ohio Certified Volunteer Naturalist program. Over a 2-week period, program participants complete 40 hours of coursework covering the natural history of Ohio. They then put that new-found knowledge to work teaching others, creating classes, assisting with conservation work, and participating in citizen science projects.

TWC Senior Naturalist Carrie Elvey says "The OCVN program is hands-down one of the best things we do at TWC. I love getting the chance to help people reconnect with the things they loved as kids, but often moved away from as adults. It's always a joy to spend the two weeks of class with like-minded folks who enjoy playing in the marsh or flipping rocks looking for salamanders." TWC has trained over 350 volunteer naturalists over the years. The impact of the volunteer work they do is phenomenal – and important. At TWC, these volunteers help with practically everything – from planting trees to leading school groups to assisting in the Native Plant Nursery.

The OCVN class is kept small to provide plenty of hands-on opportunities. This year, in addition to the class taught at TWC in June, we are also partnering with the Ashland County Soil and Water Conservation District to offer a class at their beautiful Hazel Willis Woods property in July.
